In the meantime, we need to restructure the UN so that it is more appropriate for our world, and so it prepares the world for its future goal. There will be no more permanent members of the Security Council. From now on, it will be a rotation, with caveats. I propose that there must be one member from each continent, and each will rotate amongst the countries on the continent. The position will be for five years at a time. Each year, or two, there will be five additional members elected by the General Assembly, by preferential ballot, with the qualification that each continent is also represented. That means that on each ballot, each UN ambassador will rank their top five and each will be from a different continent. Certain countries will not be allowed to participate in these elections if they are under sanctions, or whatever else the UN might do. There is nothing else I would change about the UN right now. It is almost perfect. For the practical agenda of moving towards the actual world state we can start with the EU. The EU should start slowly allowing non-European countries to join based on my criteria.
